and was born in Kenya. His family is a very devout Catholic family. He has two brothers and two sisters. His family supports his desire to become a Catholic priest. He studied to become a computer analyst after high school and worked in that field for about two years. He then joined a Benedictine Community in Kenya until he could join the Christ in the Desert Community in Abiquiu, NM. He greatly desired to become a priest and through the guidance of his superiors, joined the Benedictine Monastery in Pecos, NM. However, he still had a great desire for the diocesan priesthood. Therefore, in 2013, he entered the Archdiocese of Santa Fe priestly program and went to Holy Apostles Seminary and then Mt. Angel Seminary to study to become a priest.



DEACON KEN PECCATIELLO

Ken was born in Chicago Illinois and raised in a small town 25 miles Northwest of Chicago.

He attended a Catholic grade school where he served as an altar boy. Upon graduating High School, Ken attended university at Illinois Institute of Technology for one year. During this time he met his future wife Susan who was attending a Catholic university in the area. They

married in July of 1977 and began their family.

Ken went to work for Standard Oil of Indiana [later to become Amoco Oil]. During this time-period, Ken returned to his university studies at night and after 7 years earned his degree in Chemical Engineering.

Following graduation, the family moved to the Houston Texas area; this was the first of multiple moves throughout the country. Ken, Susan, and the family have lived in Illinois, Maryland, Texas [3 different times], Louisiana, California and now New Mexico.

Ken and Susan decided to move to New Mexico as their son Bob was in seminary for the Archdiocese of Santa Fe and felt they could best support Bob in his efforts to become a priest for the Archdiocese by being close. They moved to Moriarty following the recommendation of several of the seminarians and after visiting the area.

It was here in Moriarty that the family finally found the time, coupled with the support of the faith community, to respond to God's call to service. Ken and Susan became Mayordomos at the urging of Father Young and several other ministry members.

It was in response to multiple people within the parish community that enabled Ken to respond to God's call to the Diaconate; where he entered into the Deacon Formation program. It has been with the support and the prayers of Susan, Father Lancaster and the entire parish faith community that Ken has been able to persevere during the 4-1/2 years of the formation process.

Now, Ken is very excited about his ability to serve the Estancia Valley Catholic Parish community in this new ministry of the Diaconate.

The "The Ten Commandments of Worship"

(From the Archdioceses of Santa Fe Facebook Page)

- 1. I shall arrive on time. (Please have the courtesy to remain in the back during the readings and homily).
- 2. I shall dress appropriately for worship. (Worship is not the time to draw attention to yourself).
- 3. I shall experience and acknowledge Sunday as the Day of the Lord and the Day of Rest.
- 4. I shall show reverence as I enter the House of Prayer. (Genuflect or bow before entering your pew. It is a sign of respect to the presence of the Lord. People are at prayer; this is not the time for conversation).
- 5. I shall fully participate in the Mass. (That means singing and responses as required).
- 6. I shall fast one hour before Communion. (Coffee and chewing gum break your fast. It is a small discipline).
- 7. I shall offer a sign of reverence before receiving Holy Communion. (Kneeling to receive the Lord's Body is not required, but is permitted).
- 8. I shall say "Amen" before receiving Communion. (Meaning, "I believe").
- 9. I shall give thanks after Communion. (Prayer in the pew before the closing prayer).
- 10. I shall remain until the end of Mass. (Mass is not over until the Celebrant leaves! However, some may have a legitimate reason to leave early especially if disabled).
